- Public Agency: part of a governing entity – generally a city or county.

- Private agency with a contract to perform animal control functions for a city or county: These agencies combine the functions of a private shelter and a public non-profit in one group.
- Open admissions Shelter: This is a traditional type of sheltered agency that accepts all animals brought to them, either strays or owner relinquished pets.
- Limited admissions sheltered or unsheltered agency: These are often called no-kill agencies because they do not euthanize animals.
- Rescue group: These groups generally take animals from other public and private shelters.
- Breed rescue group: These are often part of dog or cat breed clubs who are interested in saving the animals of their specific breed from being euthanized.

**PetSmart and PetSmart Charities requires all animals be properly vaccinated before entering the store for adoptions. Below is a list of our requirements:**

All dogs and puppies receive a distemper-parvo vaccine that includes, distemper, adenovirus, parainfluenza, parvovirus, and bordetella at 6– 8 weeks of age, 12 weeks and also at 16 weeks. Thereafter yearly or as recommended by the Vet. A rabies vaccine must be administered in accordance with state law.

All cats and kittens require a 4 in 1 vaccine, which includes chlamydia, panleukopenia, calicivirus, and rhinotracheitis between 6 to 8 weeks of age. Boosters are then administered in a series at 12 weeks and 15 weeks. Thereafter yearly or as recommended by the Vet. A rabies vaccine must be administered in accordance with state law.
